On Sunday the 10.30am Mass at St. Benedict's Shrine will be offered for the Faithful Departed as well as the 7.30am Mass at St. Therese's Church.

Jasna Góra Monastery Poland Your prayers are asked for the Pauline community in Poland, especially at our Mother House and Monastery of Jasna Góra in Częstochowa where a Covid-19 outbreak has infected some members of the community, hospitalising four of our monks, one of whom is critical and in a coma. We pray through the Intercession of our Blessed Mother for a return to good health of those infected.

2020 HSC Exams The 2020 HSC Written Exams began Tuesday 20th October. It has been a particularly challenging year for our HSC students this year. On behalf of the Smithfield Parish we extend our prayers and best wishes to all the students who will sit these exams in the coming weeks, especially at Mary MacKillop College, Cerdon College and Patrician Brother's College Fairfield.

Church Doors Please be advised that access to the church via the main centre glass doors of St. Benedict's Shrine is unavailable at the current time. There has been some accidental damage to the doors which means that they cannot be used. Please use the other glass doors at the main entrance for the church.

New Church Regulations

As you may have heard during the week the NSW Government has amended the number of people able to attend a place of worship. The main change is that from this weekend, up to 300 people are permitted indoors, **subject to the 4m² rule**. This means that St. Benedict's Shrine will now have an increased capacity to **150 people**. St. Therese's church and Montefano Hall will continue with their current regulations (50 and 90 persons respectively). We are still awaiting confirmation about numbers able to attend funerals and weddings. Outdoor gatherings are limited to **30** people. The Archdiocese will be asking the NSW Government to reconsider this restriction with a view to Christmas celebrations. We will keep you updated as soon as any new information is given.

Overflow Mass 10.30am Sunday

In recent weeks it has come to our attention that the 10:30am Mass is a popular choice for our Parishioners. In order to follow NSW State guidelines and to ensure your access to celebrate Sunday Mass, there will be an overflow Mass in the Montefano Hall.

NSW Health Recommendation: Wearing face Masks

Recently, the NSW Premier has now <u>recommended</u> that people wear masks when they are in crowded places and social distancing is not easy to maintain. She cites as examples public transport and places of worship. I thank our parishioners for their great efforts maintaining their social distance, but because people remain together there for 40 or more minutes, it would seem that masks will provide an <u>additional safeguard</u>. It is not compulsory in NSW but <u>strongly recommended</u>. The primary precautions remain hand sanitising and distance.

COVID-19 SAFETY PLAN

- Contact Tracing: Write your name and contact details on the sheets provided at the doors of St Benedict's, St Therese's, & Montefano Hall (these are kept for contact tracing and will be destroyed after 28 days)
- Hand Sanitiser: Use the hand sanitiser at the doors of the church. This is essential.
- Sanitising the church: After each service the churches and Montefano Hall are sanitised using commercial grade disinfectant detergent.
- ♦ Seating: Sit in the allocated seating. In both the churches there is an 'X' marked on the Pews, and in the Montefano Hall chairs placed at social distancing for you to be seated safely. Please <u>ONLY</u> sit where the Pew is marked. People living in the same household may sit together in the Pews.
- ♦ Confession: Confession times have resumed. Again, please only sit on the pews with the yellow X.
- \lozenge Sign of Peace with a nod, bow, smile or wave. No physical contact.
- Receiving Holy Communion: The recommended way of receiving Holy Communion is on the hand. Please remain in your pew and Holy Communion will be brought to you.
- Planned Giving & Collections: At ALL Masses, there are two boxes at the doors of the church for 1st and 2nd Collection. You can place your offering as you enter or leave the church. Alternatively, you may wish to make use of electronic transfer. Details are in the bulletin Thank you for your continued support of your Parish and your priests.
- Limiting exposure: Health guidelines encourage us not to remain for unnecessary amounts of time in groups. It is essential to maintain social distancing.
- At Risk Persons: According to recommendations those at risk (those over 70 years of age, those with any symptoms, those with compromised immune or respiratory systems), are asked to consider carefully your health and safety when considering attending a Church Service.

If you show any symptoms, please refrain from attending church services at this time. The dispensation from Sunday Mass is still in place by Archbishop.

The dispensation from Sunday Mass is still in place by Archbishop. However, in his latest Pastoral letter the Archbishop states that 'those who are at low risk of infection and able...are exhorted to take all reasonable steps to attend Sunday Mass".

I understand that we may feel some frustration at this time around certain regulations and recommendations but know that we are working in the best interest of all in our community. *Thank you for your patience and understanding.*

Church use during COVID-19 Please take note that during the current Pandemic situation if a family has chosen a priest from outside the Smithfield Parish to preside at a wedding or funeral or other religious service, then it is a requirement that the family arrange for the church to be cleaned and sanitised. The Parish will only take responsibility for Parish events with our priests.

Upon contacting the Sacramental Office, a meeting may be organised with the Parish Priest to discuss your circumstances further and a decision will be made at the Parish Priest's discretion.

Due to the ongoing health situation the decision has been made not to hold the Pet's Mass this year. However, you are invited to bring a picture of your pet to the 10.30am Mass this Sunday 25th October for a blessing.

Parish Sign-In

Please ensure that when attending Parish events that *you continue to sign-in* with your name and contact details on the sign-in sheets provided at St. Benedict's Shrine, St. Therese's Church and Montefano Hall. This is a *compulsory regulation by the NSW Government* as part of our COVID-Safe Business Plan and will ensure that we can safely operate. This protocol is also a major factor in determining the easing of restriction in the future. Please also ensure that you sanitise your hands with the hand sanitisers provided.

It has come to our attention that there are a number of SPAM Emails circulating in the community with the sender as Fr. Jarek Zan. Parish Maintenance

Over the past few months there has been a lot of activity in the church with maintenance projects. There are a number of maintenance projects that still need to be completed. Some have been put on hold due to Covid-19 but others are unavoidable and urgent. In particular:

repairs to the roof at St. Benedict's Shrine. This work was completed during the week at a cost of \$12,000 to the Parish. Thank you for the anonymous donation of \$3,000 towards this project.

Installation of CCTV security, due to occur in the next few weeks at a cost estimated at \$12,000.

These works are only made possible by the generous donations of Parishioners and Benefactors. Thank you to those who have already contributed to our maintenance. If you are able and would like to make a contribution to our maintenance, please contact the Parish Priest via the Parish Office. Thank you for your continued support of your Parish.

Safeguarding: The Catholic Archdiocese of Sydney have introduced new requirements for volunteers 18yrs and over. All volunteers must sign a Volunteer Acceptance Form, a Code of Conduct for Working with Children and complete a Safeguarding Induction Training Course.
