A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked, 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not,' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.'

Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you – unknown to you – the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.

New Liturgical Year begins: Sunday cycle B, weekday cycle 1

ADVENT has a twofold character, for it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight.

#### THE ADVENT WREATH

One of the major symbols of the Advent season is the wreath. The encircling wreath is symbolic of God without beginning or end and the green foliage represents our hope in God. There are usually five candles in the wreath, a central white candle representing the light of Christ that came into the world and then four outside candles that are usually purple and rose coloured. The first candle is generally symbolic of Hope and Expectation. The third candle – the rose or pink candle – celebrates the Joy that is anticipated in the coming of Christ. The progressive lighting of the candles marks the journey towards the Nativity.

#### **COVID 19: New Regulations**

As of Monday 7<sup>th</sup> December 2020, the NSW Government has implemented changes to their Covid regulations for places of worship. Accordingly, capacity limits for places of worship have been replaced with the 2m² rule. This means that St. Benedict's Shrine can now hold 300 people, St. Therese's Church 100 people and Montefano Hall 180 people. If the churches reach their limit, outdoor seating can be arranged and comply with the 2m² rule. Singing by congregations and choirs is now permitted with up to 50 choristers indoors and no limit outdoors. However, the choir is subject to distancing regulations.

Holy Water will still be removed from the stoops in the church, however, should you wish to take some holy water home, there is some available. Please bring a bottle with you and ask the acolyte or priest.

This week we will also return to the practice of coming forward to receive Holy Communion. We ask that you be mindful of the distance between yourself and the person in front of you when leaving your pew for communion. Receiving Holy Communion in the hand continues to be encouraged at this time.

In the coming weeks we will gradually re-introduce the collection plate at Mass according to guidelines set out from the Sydney Chancery Office. Until then, please continue to make use of the collection boxes in the church foyer and electronic transfers.

NSW Health continues to encourage the wearing of masks in places where people do not feel they can appropriately distance.

As part of the Covid-safe Plan for the Parish, it is still imperative that you record your attendance at church. <u>Please ensure that you sign-in</u> at the various Parish venues when you gather.

#### Dispensation now lifted

The Archbishop of Sydney has lifted the dispensation of Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation:

In light of the significant easing of the restrictions upon church attendance, I rescind my decree of 20 March 2020 dispensing the faithful of Sydney from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and the Holy Days of Christmas and the Assumption. Under canon 1247 attendance at Mass on those days is now obligatory once again.

You can find the Archbishop's comments in the 8<sup>th</sup> Pastoral Letter for the Archdiocese of Sydney. There are some copies available in the church foyer or you can read the letter on the Bulletin Board or on-line.
