In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit, and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.

Feast of The Presentation of the Lord

You are invited to bring candles to be blessed on this day. Candles will be available for purchase at the Piety stall **this weekend** at all Masses.

Memorial of St. Blaise

On Wednesday 3rd February we celebrate the memorial of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr. Tradition tells us that while Blaise was being taken into custody, a distraught mother, whose only child was choking on a fishbone, threw herself at his feet and implored his intercession. Touched at her grief, he offered up his prayers, and the child was cured. Consequently, Saint Blaise is invoked for protection against injuries and illnesses of the throat. The blessing of throats will occur after 7am Mass.

COVID-19 update

In keeping with NSW Health directives, anyone attending a church either for private prayer or for a service must wear a face mask. The only exemptions are those with a medical condition, where it is essential to remove a mask to carry out one's responsibilities (e.g. readers) or children under the age of 12. NSW Health can impose a \$200 fine on each individual failing to abide by this rule.

The number of people attending church services has been changed this week by the State Government. Under the new regulations there is no longer a "cap" of people attending, as long as the 4m² rule is applied. As such, St Benedict's Shrine can hold a maximum of 150 people, St. Therese's Church 50 people and Montefano Hall 90 people. This includes regular Mass, weddings, funerals and baptisms.

QR Codes

The NSW Government strongly recommends the use of QR Codes for contact tracing should the need arise. There are QR Codes at the doors of St. Benedict's Shrine, St. Therese's Church and the Montefano Hall. For those who are able, we ask that you use the QR code when entering the parish sites and to show the usher at the door your successful registration. For those who cannot use the QR Codes you are still able to 'sign-in' using the sheets at the doors of the parish buildings.

Working With Children Check (WWCC)

It has come to our attention that a number of Parish volunteers have expired WWCC. Due to Covid the NSW granted a 6 month period of 'grace' until 15 September 2020. This time has now passed and all WWCCs must be current. If your WWCC expired in 2020 it is imperative you renew your WWCC to continue with your Parish Ministry. Failing to renew your WWCC will mean that you will have to re-do the application from start resulting in a NEW WWCC number. Once you have renewed your WWCC please email your documents to wwcc@stgertrude.org.au or contact the Parish office. If you are having difficulties renewing, please contact the Parish Office for assistance.
