Even before the celebration itself, it is commendable that silence be observed in the church, in the sacristy, in the vesting room, and in adjacent areas, so that all may dispose themselves to carry out the sacred action in a devout and fitting manner." (GIRM 45). As a courtesy to God and to others, please maintain this sacred silence.

### **COVID UPDATES FROM ARCHDIOCESE OF SYDNEY**

New COVID 19 restrictions for Greater Sydney The NSW government has announced a further tightening of COVID 19 restrictions for all of Greater Sydney, including the Central Coast, Wollongong and Shellharbour regions.

Churches were closed to the public from 6pm on Saturday 26 June 2021 until at least midnight on Friday 9 July 2021.

Funerals may proceed at this time, with a maximum of 100 people in attendance and subject to a four square metre rule.
