The logic of the Kingdom – God's basileia – is such that opposites are related: the extraordinary and the ordinary (like the alpha and the omega) are interrelated attributes of the person of Jesus.

**Street Parking** Please be mindful and respectful when street parking your car when attending Mass. We have received a call from Fairfield Council stating residents have concerns in regards to vehicles parking in Stella Street obstructing vehicle access to/from residential properties on the weekends and some people are partially blocking
