O people of Sion, behold, the Lord will come to save the nations, and the Lord will make the glory of his voice heard in the joy of your heart.

FIRST READING *Is* 40:1-5. 9-11

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

'Console my people, console them' says your God.
'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.'

New Liturgical Year begins:

Sunday cycle B, weekday cycle 1



ADVENT has a twofold character, for it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight.

THE ADVENT WREATH

One of the major symbols of the Advent season is the wreath. The encircling wreath is symbolic of God without beginning or end and the green foliage represents our hope in God. There are usually five candles in the wreath, a central white candle representing the light of Christ that came into the world and then four outside candles that are usually purple and rose

coloured. The first candle is generally symbolic of Hope and Expectation. The third candle – the rose or pink candle –

celebrates the Joy that is anticipated in the coming of Christ. The progressive lighting of the candles marks the journey towards the Nativity.

Advent Program "Adore" will be available this week, the cost is \$5. We are inviting our parishioners to reflect on Nativity of Our Lord with there families during this holy time of Advent.

COVID-19

As you will have seen from the media reports earlier this week, the NSW Government has announced a significant easing of restrictions on Places of Worship which will come into effect on **Monday**

7 December. We are still waiting on the new Public Health Order to be issued, hopefully sometime over the weekend, but we know that churches will now be subject to the 1 person per 2sqm rule in line with other venues and there will be no upper limit as there currently has been. Therefore St. Benedict's Shrine has the capacity to have 300 people and St. Therese's church up to 100.

Funerals and Weddings are limited to 300 persons.

Permission is now given to congregate outdoors if numbers in the Church are up to capacity, as outdoor gatherings are also based on the 2sqm rule and up to 500 people.

Choirs will be able to have 50 people indoors and no limit outdoors. Congregational singing is allowed.

The Archbishop will be lifting the dispensation to attend Sunday Mass once the 2sqm rule comes into effect. We will issue further communications next week but it is important that you are alert to these changes and be back to Mass from now on.

Church use during COVID-19 Please take note that during the current Pandemic situation if a family has chosen a priest from outside the Smithfield Parish to preside at a wedding or funeral or other religious service, then it is a requirement that the family arrange for the church to be cleaned and sanitised. The Parish will only take responsibility for Parish events with our priests.
