BAPTISM OF THE LORD

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON *Cf. Mt 3:16-17*

After the Lord was baptized, the heavens were opened, and the Spirit descended upon him like a dove, and the voice of the Father thundered:

Listen, listen to me, and you will have good things to eat and rich food to enjoy.
Pay attention, come to me listen, and your soul will live.

With you I will make an everlasting covenant out of the favours promised to David.
See, I have made of you a witness to the peoples, a leader and a master of the nations.
See, you will summon a nation you never knew, those unknown will come hurrying to you, for the sake of the Lord your God, of the Holy One of Israel who will glorify you.

Seek the Lord while he is still to be found, call to him while he is still near.
Let the wicked man abandon his way, the evil man his thoughts.
Let him turn back to the Lord who will take pity on him,

Patriarch of the Pauline Order

Solemnity of St. Paul the First Hermit

St. Paul the First Hermit or Paul of Thebes is the Patriarch of the Pauline Order. The Solemnity of St. Paul will be celebrated on Friday 15th January. As a parish Community we will celebrate this important solemnity of the Pauline Fathers on Sunday 17th January at the 10.30am Mass, using the Votive Mass of St. Paul the First Hermit and readings of the day.

<u>Blessing of Children:</u> as is the custom for the Pauline Order, there will be a special blessing for children on the Solemnity.

<u>Blessing of Fruits:</u> we will also have the customary blessing of Palm Fruit (dates) at Mass.

COVID-19 update

In keeping with NSW Health directives, anyone attending a church either for private prayer or for a service must wear a face mask. The only exemptions are those with a medical condition, where it is essential to remove a mask to carry out one's responsibilities (e.g. readers) or children under the age of 12. NSW Health can impose a \$200 fine on each individual failing to abide by this rule.

The number of people attending church services has also been "capped" at 100, provided the 4m² rule is applied. As such, St. Benedict's Shrine can hold a maximum of 100 people, St. Therese's Church 50 and Montefano Hall 90 people. This includes regular Mass, weddings, funerals and baptisms.

QR Codes

The NSW Government strongly recommends the use of QR Codes for contact tracing should the need arise. There are QR Codes at the doors of St. Benedict's Shrine, St. Therese's Church and the Montefano Hall. For those who are able, we ask that you use the QR code when entering the parish sites and to show the usher at the door your successful registration. For those who cannot use the QR Codes you are still able to 'sign-in' using the sheets at the doors of the parish buildings.
