Spiritual Adoption of the Unborn Child

What is Spiritual Adoption?

It is a prayer for the child in the womb who is threatened by abortion.

It is a prayer of healing for those suffering because of abortion.

It is a prayer of consolation for those sorrowing because of a miscarriage.

It is a movement of life and fruitfulness inspired by the Holy Spirit.

The Spiritual Adoption lasts for nine months. The prayer consists of praying one decade of the Rosary each day for nine months and a prayer for your adopted child. We will start this spiritual adoption on the Feast of the Annunciation - 25th March. More information will be given in the parish bulletin

Youth Group returns! After a long absence our Parish Youth Group will resume on **Sunday 21st February**. Join us for Mass at 6pm and following the Mass, youth meeting in the Parish Demountables. This year there will be 2 groups: Kindergarten - Year 8, and Year 9 and above. New members and returning members are most welcome.

COVID-19 UPDATE

There have been some changes to the NSW Health directives in regards to places of worship: The wearing of masks is no longer mandatory. However, NSW Health does maintain that this is strongly recommended. The number of people attending church services has also changed. Under the new regulations, there is no longer a "cap" of people attending provided that the one person per 2m2 rule is observed. As such, St. Benedict's Shrine can hold a maximum of 300 people, St. Therese's Church 100 people and Montefano Hall 180 people. This includes regular Mass, weddings, funerals and baptisms.

Unfortunately, congregational singing is still not allowed at this time.

Dispensation Lifted

Archbishop Anthony Fisher has lifted the dispensation from our Sunday Mass obligation. The Catholic faithful are once again obliged to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation when this is reasonably possible. Those who are of great age, have health conditions or are otherwise anxious about the risks of COVID-19 are free to remain at home and find another way of keeping the Sabbath holy.

QR Codes:

The NSW Government strongly recommends the use of QR Codes for contact tracing should the need arise. There are QR Codes at the doors of St. Benedict's Shrine, St. Therese's Church and the Montefano Hall. For those who are able, we ask that you use the QR code when entering the parish sites and to show the usher at the door your successful registration. For those who cannot use the QR Codes you are still able to 'sign-in' using the sheets at the doors of the parish buildings.

Sacristy Regulations

Please note that the church sacristy is for the use of the priests and those who minister at Mass. No other persons should enter the sacristy or use the sacristy as a thoroughfare. If you have a Mass intention, please hand it to the Acolyte who will give it to the priest. Likewise, if you need to use the bathrooms at St. Benedict's, please do not walk through the sacristy, but rather walk around the church building. For our ministers at Mass, please note which sacristy is available to you. Junior Altar servers should not congregate in the priest's sacristy. These regulations are in place according to our Safeguarding Protocols, WHS, and current Covid practices. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

Working With Children Check (WWCC)

It has come to our attention that a number of Parish volunteers have expired WWCC. Due to Covid, the NSW granted a 6 month period of 'grace' until 15 September 2020. This time has now passed and all WWCCs must be current. If your WWCC expired in 2020 it is imperative you renew your WWCC to continue with your Parish Ministry. Failing to renew your WWCC will mean that you will have to re-do the application from start resulting in a NEW WWCC number. Once you have renewed your WWCC please email your documents to wwcc@stgertrude.org.au or contact the Parish office. If you are having difficulties renewing, please contact the Parish Office for assistance

Tap n Go Donation

The Parish has recently installed an electronic Tap n Go collection point at St. Benedict's Shrine. The amount that is automatically deducted is \$10 which goes directly into the Church Fund or second collection loose. If you want to donate \$20, then you just need to tap twice. It is still very important that those who contribute via the Parish Planned Giving System (envelopes) continue to do so and if anyone would like to join Planned Giving, please contact the Parish Office.

Where do my Collections Go?

In Australia there are two collections at Sunday Mass. The allocation of funds is as follows:
