# BEATIFICATION OF POPE JOHN PAUL I

This week Pope Francis authorised the Congregation for the Causes of Saints to promulgate the decree on a miraculous healing attributed to the intercession of Pope John Paul I. The healing is of an 11 year old girl who had been ill with acute brain inflammation, septic shock and other grave medical conditions and was deemed to be on the verge of death by doctors. Pope John Paul I was elected Pope on 26th August 1978 following the death of Pope Paul VI and died 33 days later on 28th September 1978. He was succeeded by Pope St. John Paul II.
