

RETURN TO REGULAR CHURCH LITURGIES

After nearly three months away from each other, we are pleased to say that we are "open for prayers" once again. This means that the Parish will return to its regular Mass timetable. Thank you for your patience as we prepared the church in readiness for our resumption of regular worship and particular thanks as we endured the lockdown.

At this stage other Parish activities such as Youth, Parish BBQ, FCI, etc. are not encouraged at this time and remain 'on-hold" pending further information. Apologies for this.

NOVEMBER MASS OFFERINGS

November is the month that we traditionally pray for all our deceased relatives and friends. November Mass Offering Envelopes are available in the pews of the church and at the doors of the church for those wishing to have their loved ones included in the November Masses. These offerings for the deceased will be offered as a collective Gregorian Mass.

INDULGENCES FOR THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

There are many indulgences that can be obtained in the month of November for the souls in purgatory:

- Plenary Indulgence:
 - o on any and each day from November 1st 8th visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the faithful departed

......

- on All Souls' Day (or on the Sunday preceding or following it, or on All Saints Day) devoutly visit a church or an oratory and recite an Our Father and the Creed.
- Partial Indulgence:
 - Devoutly visit a cemetery and at least mentally pray for the dead
 - Devoutly recite lauds or vespers from the Office of Reading or the "Eternal Rest" Prayer.

To gain the Plenary indulgence the faithful must be in a state of grace, free from mortal and venial sin, receive the sacrament of confession/reconciliation, receive Eucharist and recite prayers for the intentions of the Pope.

Due to the ongoing pandemic and related health and safety measures, the Apostolic Penitentiary is once again extending opportunities to gain indulgences for the benefit of the faithful departed. The Decree allows that the faithful gain plenary indulgences on every day in November, and not just from the 1st to the 8th. Those indulgences related to All Souls' Day are also extended for the entire month of November.

PRAYER FOR HSC STUDENTS

Heavenly Father, we bring before you our HSC students. Give them the gifts of wisdom, right judgement, knowledge and courage. Bless them with calm hearts and clarity of mind as they sit for their exams. May they be affirmed in their efforts and may they know that you are there with them. The Parish has ordered a number of copies of the "Blessed.

Advent and Christmas Daily Reflections". These should arrive in the next few weeks and will be available for purchase after Mass.

A FEW CHANGES TO COVID REGULATIONS... AGAIN!

- Religious services are now 1 per 2 square metres.
- Masks must still be worn indoors for all persons over the age of 12
- Singing is allowed, for the fully vaccinated, with masks on.

Weddings in NSW may have up to:

- 1 person per 2 square metres of space for indoor or outdoor areas
- All people attending a wedding must be **fully vaccinated** (otherwise it is 11 person limit)

Funerals and memorial services in NSW may have up to:

- 1 person per 2 square metres of space for indoor or outdoor areas.
- All people attending the funeral or memorial service must be fully vaccinated (otherwise it is a 10 person limit).
- Exercise classes within the parish hall, bingo or card gatherings are not permitted: they are not sufficiently connected to the concept of 'worship' to be encompassed by the regulations permitting gathering for people regardless of vaccination status.
