

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Over the last week we have been shocked and saddened by the reported stabbings at Westfield Bondi on Saturday and then on Monday the violence and consequent civil unrest on our own doorstep at Wakeley. Firstly, on behalf of the Parish of Smithfield I would like to offer to the victims of the Bondi stabbing and their families our sincere condolences and prayers of support. While as a community we were still trying to make sense of this act of violence, we then were confronted with the stabbing of Bishop Mar Mari Emmanuel and Father Isaac Royel in our own backyard of Wakeley. This act bringing with it the fact that it occurred at a place of worship against a cleric and his congregation.

Images of this attack were shared across several media and social media outlets. Needless to say that they were particularly confronting to many. The consequent events that occurred outside the church were equally as confronting as our emergency services were confronted with anger from a mob determined to exact revenge and to bring about civil and religious unrest. Violence of any kind is not to be supported and needs to be condemned as it undermines the fabric of our society. The only thing that violence accomplishes it that it breeds fear and suspicion which can only lead to more conflict. Rather than reacting in this way I encourage our Parishioners to use prayer as a way to peace.

Recently in our Sunday Scriptures we have heard how the Risen Christ has appeared to his Disciples. The disciples, locked up in that Upper Room out of fear, did not want to face the future, two of them even ran away from the city to find some solace. But it is the Risen Christ who seeks those broken, afraid and confused disciples. Then standing in the middle of them says "Peace be with You". The Risen Christ brought to the group a unity that was fractured by the violent act of crucifixion and it is the Risen Christ who brought courage in the midst of their own fear and confusion. It is the Risen Christ who seeks us also in our current situation and invites us to healing, unity and peace and commissions us to be makers of peace through prayer and forgiveness.

I join in support with our Archbishop Anthony Fisher in insisting that "every person in this country, be they bishop or priest, rabbi or imam, minister or congregant, should be able to worship in safety, without fear that they be subject to acts of violence while gathering in prayer". I would like to encourage all our Parishioners to be continue to pray both in our places of worship and in private and to avoid any acts of civil unrest. The misguided and misinterpreted ideology of the few should not be the cause of division, rather we should use love — caritas — as the means to unity.

May we continue to pray for peace in our globe and among our close neighbours.

God bless you all and in the words of the Resurrected Christ "Peace be with You".
