How can he now say, "I have come down from heaven"?' Jesus said in reply, 'Stop complaining to each other.

'No one can come to me unless he is drawn by the Father who sent me. and I will raise him up at the last day. It is written in the prophets: They will all be taught by God, and to hear the teaching of the Father, and learn from it. is to come to me. Not that anybody has seen the Father. except the one who comes from God: he has seen the Father.

I tell you most solemnly, everybody who believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life. Your fathers ate the manna in the desert and they are dead; but this is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that a man may eat it and not die. I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world."

SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION THIS THURSDAY 15TH AUGUST

The Assumption of Mary is one of the four Marian Dogmas of the Catholic Church. Pope Pius XII defined it on 1st November 1950 in his Apostolic Constitution titled Munificentissimus Deus as follows: We proclaim and define it to be a dogma revealed by God that the immaculate

finished, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a Holy Day of Obligation,

which means that every Catholic MUST attend Mass on this day. Mass Times:

Rosary, Litany and Benediction

6:00 pm Exposition, Rosary, Devotions and Benediction

7:00 pm Mass

The Vigil Mass of the Assumption will be celebrated on Wednesday 14th August followed by the usual Novena to St. Benedict.



BLESSING OF HERBS & FLOWERS SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION

The tradition of blessing of herbs (particularly those with medicinal or healing properties) and flowers on the Assumption dates back to as early as the tenth century in

parts of Europe. "Herbs" had not our restricted English meaning but included all kinds of cultivated and wild flowers, especially those associated with Our Lady. The blessing coincided with the harvest festival of thanksgiving to God for the great bounty of the fruits of the Earth. One old legend states that, after the Fall of Adam, all the flowers and herbs of the earth lost their beautiful scent. Only after the Assumption of Our Lady, when lilies and roses were found in her tomb, did those flowers regain their beautiful fragrances and the herbs their power to heal. Some examples of flowers associated with Our Lady include: roses (Mary's love of God); White Lily (her purity); myrtle (her virginity); Marigold (her heavenly glory).

You are also invited to place flowers on the fence at the front of the church in honour of Our Lady.
